COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course will provide a foundation in the fundamentals of threedimensional design. A clear sequence of assignments and projects introduce the concepts of form/volume, space, texture, light and time as they relate to three dimensional design. Students are also encouraged to develop critical thinking skills through critiques of student work and by evaluation of the visual world around them. Beyond the concepts and skills essential to good design practice, it is hoped that the course will open a window towards self-expression and awareness. The class will be structured with in class assignments, critiques of outside projects and occasional field trips.
