Projects include altering fundamentals; texture smoothing, shading, tonal manipulation techniques, graphics editing, color, scaling, and surface rendering. **Prerequisites:** ART 177 or permission of the instructor.

2. Preparing image files for varied outputs including print, web, and screen imaging.
3. Understanding hardware and software requirements for photo image manipulations.
4. Using advanced techniques to perform special effects on photo images.
5. Execute photo images with good composition of are elements.
6. Prepare professional presentation of images.
