

Arizona General Education Curriculum

The Arizona General Education Curriculum (AGEC) is a 35-semester credit general education program of study that fulfills lower division general education requirements for students planning to transfer to any Arizona public community college or university. There are three types of MCCCDC AGECS. They are the AGECS A, AGECS B, and the AGECS S. Designed to articulate with different academic majors, the requirements vary accordingly. **Students should consult an MCCCDC Academic Advisor to ensure appropriate course selection for general education purposes and transfer.**
