Internet Based Continuing Dental Education Courses

Once the registration and payment have been received you will be sent an access code via e-mail to the course to be completed online using Internet Explorer or Firefox. Course(s) must be completed within the term of the semester submitted to obtain credit. Deadline for course completion is May 15, 2010.

Alcoholism – Chemical Dependency - Tuition \$30 2 CEU

Alcohol dependence and treatment, and dental considerations for the alcoholic patient are covered in this course.
Category A.1

Care of Aesthetic Restorations and Implants - Tuition \$30 2 CEU

The types, uses, instrumentation and care of composite resin, porcelain and other aesthetic restoration materials are reviewed in this course. The design and materials used in implants and their professional care is also addressed.
Category A.1

Clinical Procedures in the Dental Office - Infection Control - Tuition \$30 2 CEU

The ideal features of dental office infection control procedures are outlined in this course, following OSHA regulations and CDC/ADA recommendations. Equipment disinfection, dental unit waterline asepsis, and instrument sterilization are reviewed. *Category A.1, 4*

Early Childhood Caries - Tuition \$30 2 CEU

This course presents information on early childhood caries and its etiology, prevention strategies, methods of screening, and the use of the Alternative Restorative Technique and fluoride varnishes. *Category A.1*

HIV/AIDS – Infection Control - Tuition \$30 2 CEU

An update for the dental professional on HIV infection and AIDS including a review of transmission, symptoms, oral manifestations, diagnosis, treatment, prevention and research. *Category A.1, 4*

Local Anesthesia Review I - Tuition \$30 2 CEU

This is a review of anatomy, techniques and medical history considerations in the administrations of local anesthetics.
Category A.1

Local Anesthesia Review II - Tuition \$30 2 CEU

This module reviews the pharmacology of local anesthetics and administration of nitrous oxide -oxygen analgesia.
Category .1A

Medical Emergencies I - Tuition \$30 2 CEU

In this course, prevention of medical emergencies in the dental office through complete evaluation of the medico-dental history and patient assessment is explored. Legal and ethical issues in medical history documentation are also addressed.
Category A.1

Medical Emergencies II - Tuition \$30 2 CEU

The identification and management of medical emergencies in the dental environment are covered in this course. A suggested office protocol including procedures, equipment and drugs is offered. *Category A.1*

Oral Pathology Review - Tuition \$30 2 CEU

This interactive program reviews the signs and symptoms of many oral conditions and diseases likely to be found in clinical practice. It includes case histories of individuals, accompanied by photographs. You will be asked to identify the oral condition present, and answer questions about treatment. This will provide you with immediate feedback which will allow you to assess your knowledge of the topics presented. *Category A.1*

Professionalism and Ethics in Dentistry - Tuition \$30 2 CEU

This course provides an overview of professionalism and a more specific look at ethics and how ethics is applied in the dental office. Terminology is introduced and the difference between morals and ethics is addressed. Steps to think through an ethical dilemma are also explored. *Category A.3*

Protection for the Dental Team and Patient – Infection Control - Tuition \$30

2 CEU

Personal protection for the dental team and prevention of cross-contamination to protect the patient are covered in this course. OSHA regulations, as well as CDC and ADA recommendations in this area are highlighted. *Category A.1, 4*

Tobacco Cessation – Chemical Dependency - Tuition \$30 2 CEU

The hazards of and treatment of nicotine addiction are reviewed in this course, including a recommended dental office tobacco cessation protocol. Oral manifestations and correlation to periodontal disease are covered. *Category A.1, 3*

Transmissible Diseases – Infectious Diseases - Tuition \$30 2 CEU

This course provides an update for the dental professional on emerging infectious diseases, the infectious disease process, and pathogens transmissible by the oral cavity. *Category A.1, 4*

Oral Radiography Classes, Spring 2010

New Digital Format

This course meets once a week for eight weeks and may be taken by those preparing to become certified to expose oral radiographs in the State of Arizona. To become x-ray certified, candidates must pass a written and clinical exam administered by the Dental Assisting National Board. Call DANB at: 1-800-367-3262 or visit their website at www.danb.org for exam information and application forms.

The lecture portion of the class may be taken separately as a review, or the entire program can be taken by those who need instruction in learning how to expose and process radiographs. Topics covered in the course will include radiation protection, film mounting, evaluation and interpretation of intraoral and extraoral radiographs, infection control, and the operation and maintenance of radiographic equipment.

Phoenix College is now utilizing digital radiography. ScanX phosphor plates will be used in place of traditional x-ray film in the lab. Interproximal and periapical techniques will be taught in the lab using dental x-ray replicas (DXTTRS). Participants will be allowed to provide a patient near the end of the eight week session. The textbook, *Radiographic Imaging for Dental Auxiliaries*, or the newer version, *Radiographic Imaging for the Dental Team* is recommended and can be purchased through the Phoenix College Bookstore, (602) 285-7489.

Local Anesthesia for the Dental Hygienist – 5 Day Class Spring 2010

This lecture/lab class meets for the five days preceding the Western Regional Examining Board's Local Anesthesia/Dental Hygiene exams at Phoenix College May 15 – 19, 2010.

The course requires advance preparation which must be completed before the starting date of class. A syllabus and reading assignments (available the end of January, 2010), will be mailed to you after your registration application is received. To ensure that you will have adequate course preparation time, (an estimated 40-60 hours), please enroll early.

The textbook, Handbook of Local Anesthesia by Stanley Malamed, (5th Edition), can be purchased online at www.amazon.com, or through the Phoenix College Bookstore (602) 285-7489.

Course Objectives:

- Thorough review of head and neck anatomy
- Local anesthesia techniques
- Administration of nitrous oxide analgesia
- Identification and treatment of medical emergencies.
- Preparation for the WREB examination in local anesthesia

Must provide with your registration form:

- photocopy of a valid CPR certificate
- photocopy of a valid DH license, or proof of graduation from an accredited school
- completed Phoenix College Student Information Form

for lab use:

- two sterile aspirating syringes
- sterile hemostat
- blood pressure cuff and stethoscope
- clinical attire and patient safety glasses

Students unable to receive anesthesia for medical reasons will need to provide a patient for the lab sessions. If possible, it is recommended that all students provide patients to fill some of the lab time. This course meets the licensure requirements in all WREB states and the special requirements of Arizona, Washington and New Mexico.

A separate examination by the Western Regional Examining Board is required to obtain a valid local anesthesia certificate by the Arizona State Board of Dental Examiners. **IMPORTANT!! The closing date for the exam is April 6, 2010.** Visit WREB's website at www.wreb.org for exam information and application procedures. *Refunds for the exam will not be issued for reasons pertaining to class withdrawal or failure.*

Coronal Polishing for the Dental Assistants

- ~review oral manifestations and symptoms of systemic conditions and develop protocols for treatment considerations based on patient comfort and need
- ~know the importance of being current with research and develop tools to find and utilize sources of research on the internet and publications
- ~learn to better utilize online research aids and web sites available to professionals and patients to increase the educational role of the dental hygienist. *Category A.2*

Arizona State Board of Dental Examiners Continuing Education Rules

R4-11-1204. Dental Hygienists.

- A. A dental hygienist shall complete 54 credit hours of recognized continuing dental education* in each renewal period as follows:
1. At least 34 credit hours of recognized continuing dental education in one or more of the following areas: dental and medical health, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, dental hygiene services, periodontal disease, care of implants, maintenance of cosmetic restorations and sealants, radiology safety and techniques, managing medical emergencies in addition to CPR and new concepts in dental hygiene;
 2. No more than 14 credit hours of recognized continuing dental education in one or more of the following; dental hygiene practice organization and management, patient management skills and methods of health care delivery;
 3. At least two credit hours of recognized continuing dental education in one or more of the following areas: chemical dependency, tobacco cessation, ethics, risk management and jurisprudence;
 4. At least four credit hours of recognized continuing dental education in infectious diseases and infectious disease control.
- B. A licensee who performs dental hygiene services under an affiliated practice relationship who is required to obtain continuing education under R4-11-609 may apply those credit hours to the requirements of this Section.

24 hours of self-study courses are acceptable for a dental hygienist's triennial renewal.

R4-11-1203. Dentists and Dental Consultants

Dentists and dental consultants shall complete 72 hours of recognized continuing dental education* in each renewal period as follows:

1. At least 45 credit hours of recognized continuing dental education in one or more of the following areas: dental and medical health, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, preventative services, dental diagnosis and treatment planning, dental clinical procedures, administration of oral sedation, managing medical emergencies in addition to CPR, corrective and restorative oral health, basis dental sciences which may include current research, new concepts in dentistry, behavioral and biological sciences that are oriented to dentistry. A licensee who holds a permit to administer general anesthesia, semi conscious sedation, conscious sedation, or oral conscious sedation who is required to obtain continuing education pursuant to Article 13 may apply those credit hours to the requirement of this Section;
2. No more than 18 credit hours of recognized continuing dental education in one or more of the following areas: dental practice organization and management, patient management skills and methods of health care delivery;
3. At least 3 credit hours of recognized continuing dental education chemical dependency, which may include tobacco cessation; and
4. At least 6 credit hours of recognized continuing dental education in infectious diseases and infectious disease control.

24 hours of self study courses are acceptable for a dentist's triennial renewal.

*"Recognized continuing dental education" means a program whose content directly relates to the art and science or oral health and treatment, provided by a recognized dental school as defined in ARS 32-12-1(18), recognized dental hygiene school as defined in ARS 32-1201 (17), or sponsored by a national or state dental, dental hygiene association, dental or dental hygiene study club, governmental agency or commercial dental supplier.
