Access to Over 23,000 eBooks!

ebrary is a database of academic electronic books. You can view the entire text of a book in a pdf type format—that means that each page looks exactly the same in **ebrary** as it does in print!

Steps to Access:

1. Start at the Library homepage.
2. Select ‘ebooks’ from the quick links menu.
3. Select ebrary.

Why Create an Account?

Your ebrary account allows you to set up a virtual “bookshelf” where you can keep a list of ebooks you select, highlighted passages in the text, and personal notes about the book. Create numerous accounts, maybe even one for each class, so that you can keep books specific to a subject available in one place.

How to Create an Account

1. Select the **Sign In** box located in the upper left corner.
2. Then select the link [Do you need to create a new bookshelf?](#)
3. Fill out the form. When you are finished click on **Create Your Bookshelf**

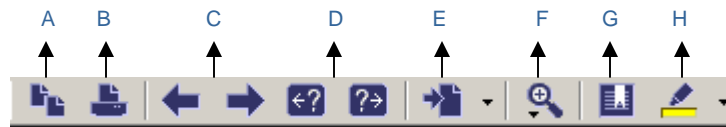
Search

Simple Search will look for the words you typed anywhere in the document, including the text of the book.

- A search for Hillary Clinton will return all results for the word Hillary and all results for the word Clinton (including Bill Clinton and George Clinton).
- By putting your search terms in quotations, your search will only return results with the phrase “Hillary Clinton” but *not* Hillary Rodham Clinton.

Advanced Search will let you tailor your search even further. Search for your topic as the subject of the book. Know the exact title? Try that, too!

Toolbar



The ebrary Reader toolbar provides the following controls for navigating through the pages of an eBook:

- A. **Copy** selected text and then paste it into a Word document. (The citation information will automatically paste with it!)
- B. **Print** 10 pages at a time, 40 pages per session.
- C. **Turn pages**, both previous and next.
- D. Previous or next **highlighted selection** (usually your search words).
- E. Go to a **specific page** in the document.
- F. **Zoom** to see text better.
- G. **Bookmark** pages in the ebooks to be stored on your virtual bookshelf.
- H. **Highlight text**—choose your favorite color.

Copy/Paste

Highlight the section of text you want to copy. When the Automenu pops up, select 'Copy Text.' Paste the text into a Microsoft Word document. Notice that all of the citation information for this document is included in the paste! You can also select citation styles through the InfoTools menu.

Citing an Ebook

MLA citation style:

Author (last name, first.) Title of book. Place of Publication: publisher, year of publication. Name of Database. Online Service. Name of Library, Location of Library. Date accessed (d/m/y) <URL of service homepage>.
