Overview:

- for law enforcement officers **only**
- a one-week intensive course in the basic phlebotomy skills
 - 45 hours of onsite phlebotomy coursework
 - taught since 2000
 - designed to accommodate the time demands of law enforcement officers
 - content meets national standards and is part of the complete Phlebotomy Program at Phoenix College.
 - meets the requirements necessary to award AZ POST continuing educations credits.

Prerequisites:

- Proof of the measles/mumps/rubella (MMR) vaccinations
 - o will accept a copy of childhood records
 - o all officers must have had a TB skin test within the last 6 months.

Costs:

Dress Code:
