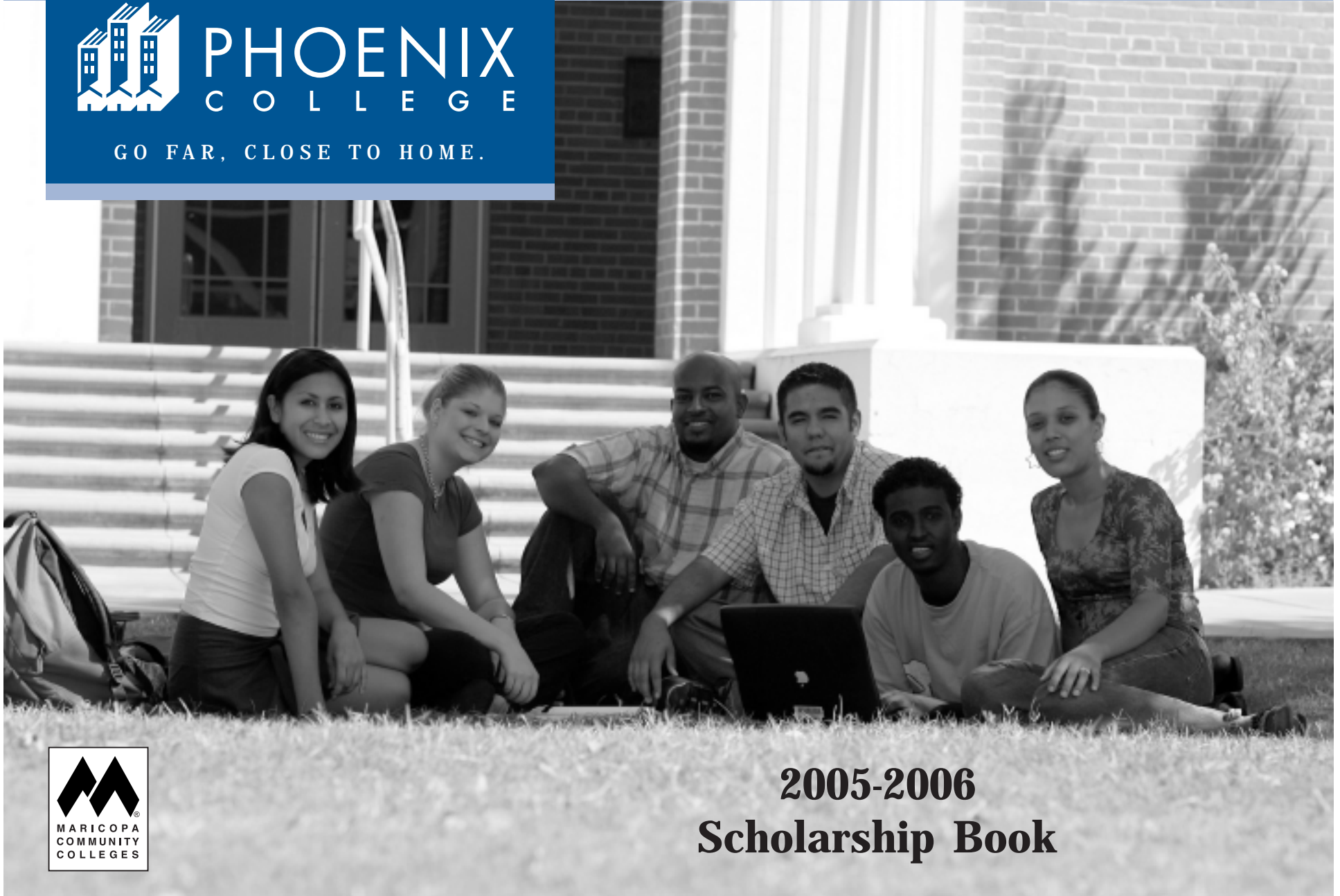

- ✓ Attend a PC Scholarship Workshop (check for dates/times offered).
- ✓ Choose scholarships for which you wish to apply.
- ✓ Work on Personal Statement.
- ✓ Request recommendation letters from sources.
- ✓ Request transcripts.
- ✓ Complete and submit application(s) with all required attachments by designated deadline(s).
- ✓ If awarded Scholarship(s), send Thank You letter(s) to donors.
- ✓ Don't forget to thank those who wrote recommendations for you.

The scholarship selection process takes from four to eight weeks to be completed. Every effort will be made to notify students who apply for Phoenix College designated scholarships the status of their application.

# General Information

## SCHOLARSHIPS AT PHOENIX COLLEGE

Congratulations! You have taken an important step towards preparing for your academic future by seeking scholarship resources to help with your educational expenses. We have designed this booklet with students in mind and hope that you find it friendly and easy to use. As you look through its contents, you will notice a variety of scholarships in the following categories (note: scholarships are listed in alphabetical order throughout the booklet):

- First-Semester College Students
- Re-Entry College Students
- Continuing College Students
- Transferring or Graduating College Students

Scholarship categories are identified in italics beneath the scholarship name. Many of the scholarships listed in this booklet are for students who plan to attend Phoenix College (PC) for the Fall and Spring semesters of the 2005-2006 school year. We hope that this booklet is helpful to you, and wish you much success in attaining your goals at Phoenix College and beyond. For the latest scholarship listings, please visit the scholarship bulletin board outside the Career Center in Hannelly Center. You may also stop by the **Office of Alumni & Development/Scholarship Relations at OSE-106** or call (602) 285-7666.

## HOW TO APPLY

The scholarship opportunities listed in this booklet all carry different deadline dates and call for different scholarship applications to be completed. While some scholarships will require you to complete a special application available at any number of locations such as campus departments or the world wide web, a number of the scholarships listed require you to complete the **General PC Scholarship Application** and submit it **by the deadline**, to qualify for consideration. For your convenience, all **PC scholarships** are designated in **bold type** throughout the booklet.

Any special application procedures will be noted in the scholarship boxes marked "Contact Information" under each scholarship heading. **Please read all scholarship descriptions carefully to be sure that you meet all of the basic criteria.** You may apply for as many scholarships as you wish, but you must submit a separate application for each. If you have questions, call the Office of Alumni & Development/Scholarship Relations at **602-285-7666/7337**. Copies of the PC General Scholarship Application are available in the Financial Aid Office (FAO). For applications requiring the **Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form**, contact the FAO in PC's Hannelly Center.

When you are ready to submit your completed application, you may use either of the following locations:

- You may come directly to the Office of Alumni & Development/Scholarship Relations (OAD) at the Osborn site (Room OSE-106). Office hours are Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m., excluding holidays.
- If it is not convenient for you to come to the Osborn site, you may drop off your application on campus at the FAO located inside Hannelly Center. Office hours are Monday - Thursday, 7:30 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. and 7:30 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. on Friday.

## FILLING OUT APPLICATIONS -

Most scholarship applications will require you to submit a written statement, also referred to as a Personal Statement. In most cases, your application is only as good as your Personal Statement! Spend time on this portion of the application. Remember, this is your chance to present yourself to the individual or group granting the scholarship, so be very clear on your answers. Criteria will vary from scholarship to scholarship, and it is important to address everything you are asked about in your writing. For example, some applications may ask you to cover the following:

- Your personal goals.
- Your academic and career goals.
- Your volunteer experience.
- Your cumulative GPA.

If you are required to complete the **General PC Scholarship Application**, at least **two letters of recommendation** are required, and **one copy of your unofficial transcripts** must be attached to each application.

## HELPFUL HINTS

- Type the application. Stay away from using fancy or elaborate fonts - they can make your application difficult to read.
- Be sure to address **all the criteria** listed in the application.
- Do not write on the back of the forms; use and attach additional pages if necessary.
- Proofread, proofread, and proofread your application! Using proper English grammar and punctuation is essential when applying for any scholarship. Ask a friend or instructor if they would look over your personal statement and application to check for errors and readability before it is submitted.

## GLOSSARY OF TERMS USED IN THIS BOOKLET

**Continuing College Students:** Enrolled at PC this semester and planning to re-enroll next semester.

**First-Semester College Students:** Not yet enrolled but planning to attend college for the first time next semester.

**Minimum Enrollment:** Refers to the minimum hours students must be enrolled in any semester to qualify for a scholarship.

**Re-Entry College Students:** Non-traditional students, age 24 and older who have had at least a 3 year break between high school and college. May be a new or continuing student.

**Transferring or Graduating College Students:** Graduating from PC or planning to transfer to a college or university.

## TYPES OF FINANCIAL AID

**Campus Employment\*:** The Federal Work-Study program allows you to work part-time in a job to earn money to help pay for education costs. PC provides various opportunities for work-study on campus.

**Federally Funded Grants\*:** These include Federal Pell, State Student Incentive and Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity grants, which are based on students' calculated financial need. Grants do not have to be repaid.

**Federal Student Loans\*:** These include Federal Stafford, PLUS and Federal Perkins loans, each with different requirements and criteria. Loans must be paid back after you either finish school or drop below half-time enrollment.

**Scholarships:** Sources include private businesses, corporations, foundations and individuals. PC's Office of Alumni & Development/Scholarship Relations (OAD) posts scholarship notices in Hannelly Center when they become available. Donors and deadlines vary, and criteria may be based upon academic or athletic excellence. Check with the OAD for specifics. Scholarships do not have to be repaid.

**Program Participation Awards:** Various departments and programs on campus offer participation awards to qualifying students. Please consult the department in which your program or course resides for further information. Among the departments/programs offering participation awards include:

## TRANSCRIPTS

Most scholarships listed will ask you to attach **academic transcripts** to your application(s) if you are currently enrolled or have attended college previously. Unofficial transcripts are acceptable in most cases (such as with the **General PC Scholarship Application**), but copies of report cards are not. First-Semester or entering freshman should attach a high school transcript.

## APPLICATION DEADLINES

The application deadlines stated in this book will vary depending on the scholarship for which you are applying. **Please refer to the row designated "Deadline" in each scholarship listing.** For all **PC Scholarships** listed, applications, attachments and letters of recommendation **must be received in the OAD or FAO by the due date.** Any materials received after the deadline will not be considered. All application materials, including letters of recommendation, must be submitted together, not separately.

## PC SCHOLARSHIP WORKSHOPS

Several times throughout the year, PC offers free **Scholarship Workshops** designed to provide students with valuable information addressing such items as:

- Writing your Personal Statement
- Tips on applying for scholarships
- What are some of the best places to find scholarship leads?
- What is Financial Need?

## PLAGIARISM AND APPLYING FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

With regards to scholarships, plagiarism is considered an academic misconduct. According to the 2005-2006 Phoenix College Student Handbook, plagiarism includes, but is not limited to, "the use of paraphrase or direct quotation of the published or unpublished work of another person without full and clear acknowledgement. It also includes the unacknowledged use of materials prepared by another person or agency engaged in the selling of term papers or other academic materials." Any application found to include plagiarized materials will be subject to review by college officials for appropriate action.
